

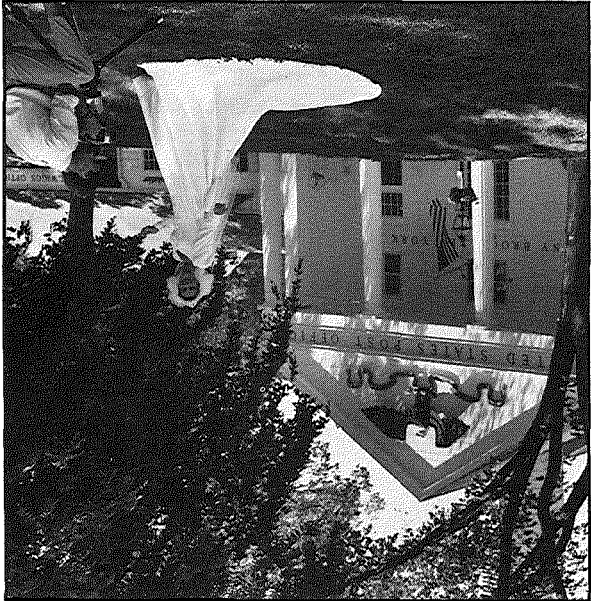

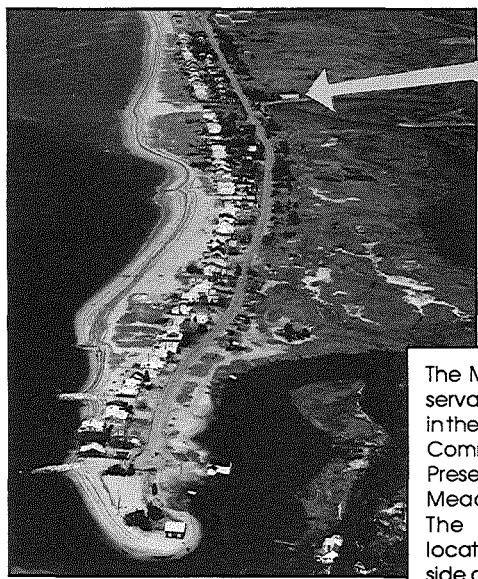

BROTHER-SISTER DRIVING TEAM SET FOR SPRING CARRIAGE RIDES

Once again "Good News Gil" and "Ginger" will be clip-clopping through colonial Stony Brook Hamlet as carriage rides get underway on Sundays, from 1:30 p.m. to 4:30 p.m. during April and May, (Except May 1). Hitched to their classic, 8-seat wagonette, the brother-sister driving team trots past the elegant federalist style post office where the mechanical eagle flaps his wings on the hour; past the historic Three Village Inn; over to the harbor and back to the Village Center.

"Good News Gil" and "Ginger" lead the good life now, but they were once simple field horses. Sold for meat in North Dakota, they traveled through the auction circuit to Pennsylvania. When Authentic Carriages finally acquired the horses, it was a major career step for the twosome. Now the fully trained driving quarterhorses are ready to spring into action for the season.

On the first Sunday in December community organizations decorate some eighty trees in the Stony Brook Village Center; carolers entertain; Santa comes to Main Street in a horse-drawn carriage and visits with children throughout the afternoon. The day closes with band music, a community sing-along, and the lighting of the 70-foot spruce on the Village Green. Noon to 5:30 p.m.

DECEMBER HOLIDAY FESTIVAL:

Children are invited to "trick 'r treat" in shops from 2:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. on Halloween afternoon. Clowns are on hand for face painting; children receive free pumpkins; surprise guests lead a costume parade around the Village Center and winning scarecrows are announced.

HALLOWEEN CELEBRATION:

Contestants create and erect scarecrows outside the shops in the Village Center. The public casts ballots for their favorite scarecrows during the two-week period when the creations are on display.

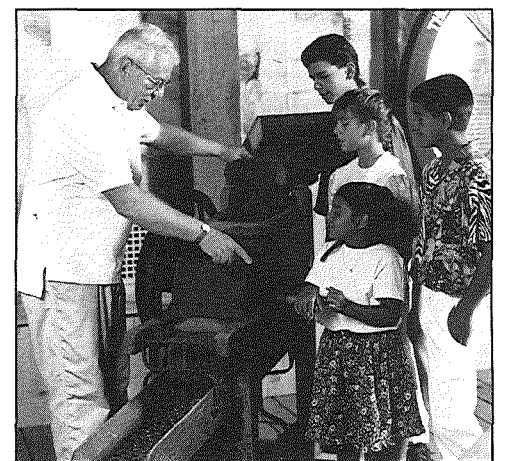

WHAT'S HAPPENING IN STONY BROOK?

STONY BROOK GRIST MILL, circa 1751

Watch millers grind corn into meal using the centuries-old process at the Stony Brook Grist Mill, circa 1751. Long Island's most completely equipped working mill, the structure is listed on the National Register of Historic Places as a rare example of 18th century Dutch framing.



Grist Mill Education Program

The Community Fund has developed a hands-on educational program for students. Children act as "dusties" (assistant millers); they husk corn, separate kernels from the cob and bag cracked corn as they learn about the history of the mill in a hands-on experience. 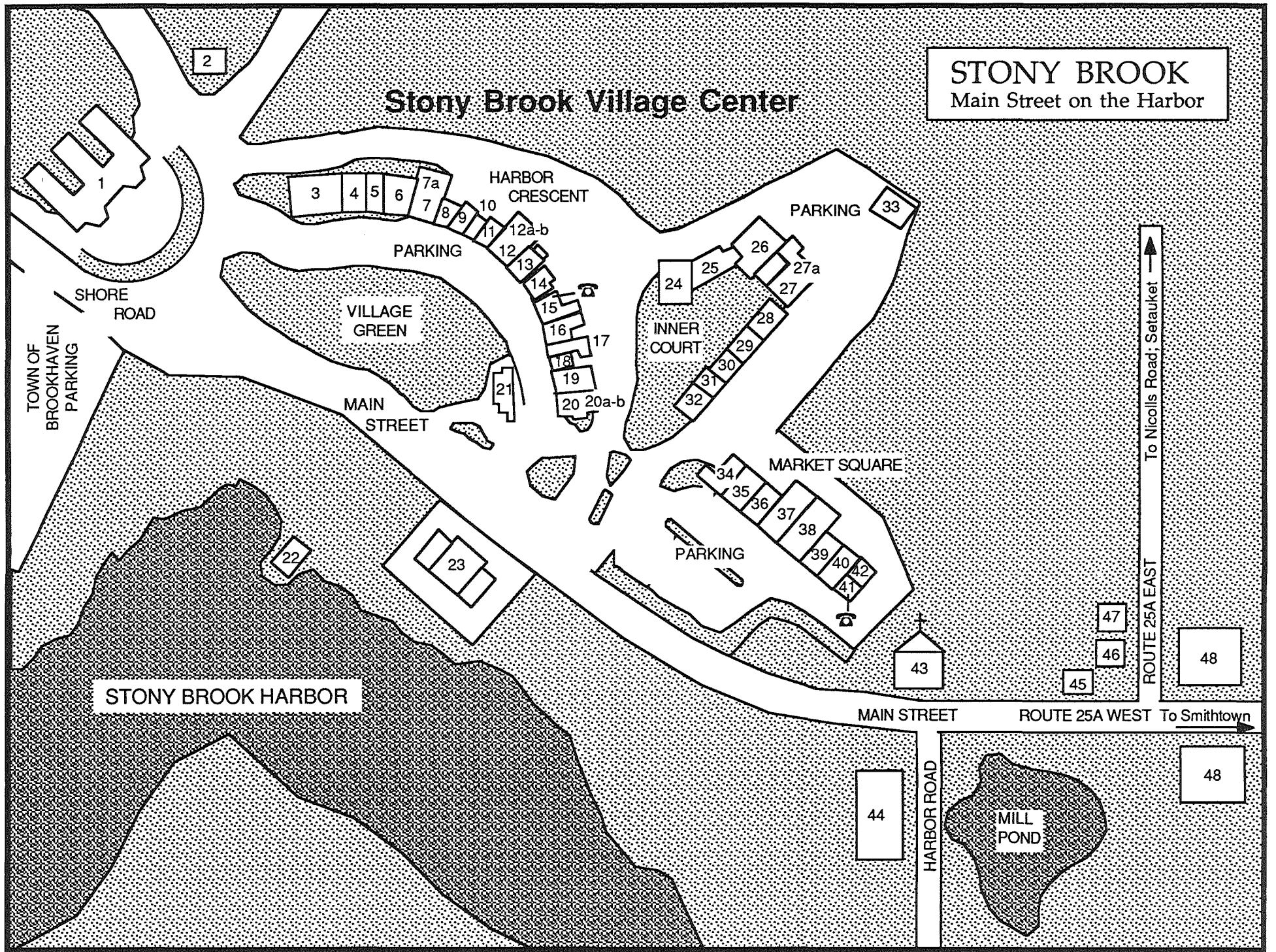
